





- Lawyer who represents the Crown (government)
- Present all evidence that supports guilt


Defense

Lawyer who represents the accused

Present evidence that supports innocence

Jury



- Twelve people
- Must be:

- 18 years or older
- Canadian citizen
- No criminal record

Jury Duty

Duty for citizens


- Jurors must:
 - Get time off work
 - Arrange transportation to trial
 - Rebook appointments



Jury Duty



Got out of jury duty by prefacing every answer with "according to the prophecy."





Jury Deliberation

- Jury Sequestered
 - Remove from outside contact

Debate over evidence only from court

All twelve must agree on the same outcome <u>beyond</u> reasonable doubt




